ISAPS members are properly trained plastic surgeons who have comprehensive surgical training in government-approved teaching hospitals and have developed their technical skills over many years. Only after passing rigorous examinations is a board certified plastic surgeon allowed to present themselves as an aesthetic plastic surgeon and subsequently operate on members of the public.

Dr Steven Wong graduated from St Bartholomews Hospital Medical College, University of London in 1975 and became a fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons (Edinburgh) in 1980. He underwent higher specialty training in Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery at the Regional Plastic Surgery Centre, Mount Vernon Hospital, Middlesex, United Kingdom.

Dr Wong returned to Malaysia in 1983 to the position of lecturer in Plastic Surgery at University Hospital, Kuala Lumpur. He subsequently left for private practice in 1985.

Dr Wong is a founder member of the Malaysian Association of Plastic, Aesthetic and Craniomaxillofacial Surgeons (MAPACS) and a past president of the same association (1994-1996). His practice deals almost exclusively with cosmetic plastic surgery. He has lectured both locally and internationally on various aspects of cosmetic surgery.

Dr Wong also holds membership for APRAS (International Confederation for Plastic Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgery) and ISAPS (The International Society of Aesthetic Surgery).

Currently, he is still in private practice at his Cosmetic Surgery Centre in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.
